Prize Money: 1st \$150

Delivery for Scarecrows: Monday 10th June to Tuesday 12th June 2024.

Students will enjoy being creative in our Scarecrow Competition. Scarecrows have helped save farmers' crops for years and this competition offers students a great opportunity to learn and apply their creative skills in a fun environment. Students will work in teams to design and construct a scarecrow to be displayed for the duration of the show.

This year's theme:

Maximum height no more than 2.5 meters, must be free standing and able to be transported
