REGISTRATIONS

Step 1: Register your entry/s online

As a nominee, please ensure you have read through the key information and documents listed on the website before registering into a competition.

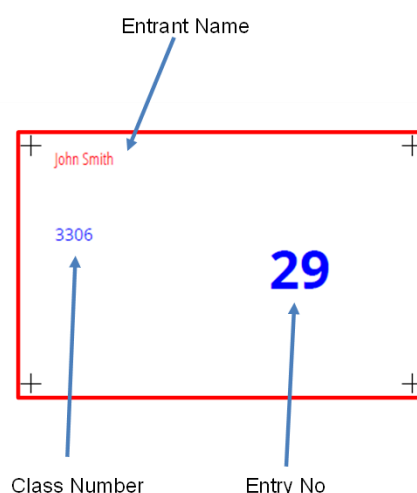
Once you are ready to submit an entry, follow the links to Showday Online to register. Fill out your entries as per Showday Online instructions and pay for your entries. Head to www.rockyshow.com.au/Competitions for more information and to enter.

Step 2: Get your exhibit/s ready

Make sure to follow the guidelines in this schedule to ensure your item/s are ready.

Exhibitor cards will be emailed to the email address you supply to Showday Online after you have finalised your application, unless arranged with the Competition Steward. The exhibitor card will look like the below. Please ensure your exhibitor card is securely attached to your exhibit at time of delivery.

1. Attach the exhibitor card to your exhibit and remove your name.
2. Keep the copy that includes your name. This is what you need to bring to collect your exhibit. It is at the discretion of the Competition Steward if the item is returned without ID or the exhibitor card.



Step 3: Deliver your item/s

Please deliver your items to the Rockhampton Showgrounds Robert Schwarten Pavilion, 8.30am – 4pm Thursday 5 June or Friday 6 June 2025.

Park on Exhibition Road and walk into the Robert Schwarten Pavilion via the foyer.

All exhibits must be delivered to the Showgrounds on the specified delivery date/s. No exhibits delivered outside the specified date/s will be accepted.

1. Exhibitor cards must be securely attached to all exhibits.
2. Any entry received soiled, damaged or otherwise unfit for display will not be exhibited.
3. Exhibits will **not be available** for collection prior to Saturday 14 June 2025.
4. The entrant copy of the exhibitor card must be retained and presented during collection for easy identification.
5. Exhibits not collected by Wednesday 18 June 2025 will be disposed of unless alternative collection arrangements have been confirmed with the Competition Steward prior to Monday 9 June 2025.
6. All prize money will be paid via cash payment at the Showgrounds Administration Office 8.30am – 4pm Monday 16 to Wednesday 18 June 2025.
 - From Thursday 19 June 2025 prize money will be available for collection from Rockhampton Regional Council City Hall Customer Service office (232 Bolsover St, Rockhampton City QLD 4700) 9am - 4pm Monday to Friday until 30 June 2025.
 - **Any prize money not collected** by 30 June 2025 will be forfeited and allocated to the next year's Show.
 - Prize money will **not** be handed out without the prize card being presented to the Competition Steward or Rockhampton Regional Council staff.
7. The Competition Committee reserves the right to disqualify any entry which in their opinion fails to meet the entry criteria. They also reserve the right to move any entry to its correct class.
8. The Judge's decision is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
9. All care will be taken, but no responsibility will be accepted for loss or damage to any exhibit by the Competition Committee.
10. Entry to the Robert Schwaren Pavilion before the Show is by authorised personnel only.

KINDY – YEAR 6

Class 8516: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle Sculpture Competition

Create a sculpture of a plant, fruit or vegetable using recycled materials, e.g. coffee cups, newspaper, wrapping paper, egg cartons, cereal boxes etc. Exhibits must be designed and constructed by the students.

Important:

- Please ensure all recycled materials are clean.
- Maximum of 1 sculpture per class.
- Maximum height no more than 2.5 metres, must be free standing and able to be transported.

Schools are challenged to transform a timber bull statue supplied by Rockhampton Agricultural Show into works of art!

SCARECROWS

Class 8518: Garden Guardians

Scarecrows have helped save farmers' crops for years and this competition offers students a great opportunity to learn and apply their creative skills in a fun environment. Students will work in teams to design and construct a scarecrow to be displayed for the duration of the Show.

Important:

- All ages class/group competition.
- Maximum height no more than 2.5 meters, must be free standing and able to be transported.
- Maximum of 2 scarecrows per class.

- Use of different mediums
- Creativeness
- Use of colour

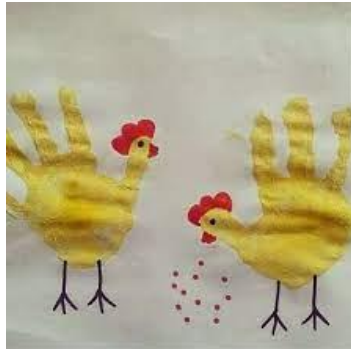
Tip: Why not get a local farmer in to talk to the children and get them excited to get out their pens and paints and start creating.

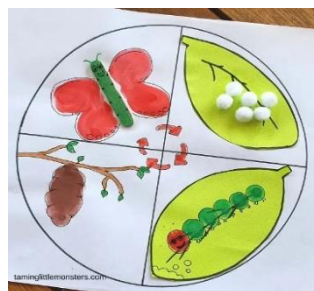


YEAR 3 & 4
