REGISTRATIONS

Step 1: Register your entry/s online

As a nominee, please ensure you have read through the key information and documents listed on the website before registering into a competition.

If you cannot pay online, CASH payments can be made at the Rockhampton Regional Council City Hall Customer Service office (232 Bolsover St, Rockhampton City QLD 4700) 9am - 4pm Monday to Friday until 23 May 2025 or at the Rockhampton Showgrounds Administration Office 8:30am - 4pm Monday to Friday from 26 May to 6 June 2025.

Rockhampton Agricultural Show may cancel or postpone the competitions at their discretion. In the event of a cancellation or postponement, where the exhibitor/competitor is unable to complete their nominated competition please note that no refunds will be provided. This includes circumstances where the exhibitor/competitor withdraws from the competition, fails to attend, or is otherwise unable to participate.

By submitting your entry, you acknowledge and accept that the Rockhampton Agricultural Show does not offer any refunds for nomination fees, or any associated costs, regardless of the reason for non-participation, postponement or cancellation of the competition.

REGULATIONS

Please review carefully as there may have been updates since the 2024 schedule.

- 1. The Rockhampton Agricultural Show and their volunteers will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibitor, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold Rockhampton Agricultural Show harmless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident.
- 2. The lodgement of a completed Animal Application for Entry form will be taken as a guarantee that the animals specified therein are free from all disease as far as is known by the owner. In the case of an infectious disease being spread through or by an exhibit, the exhibitor shall be held responsible.
- 3. Precautions will be taken to guard against fire and to protect the property at the Show, but exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Rockhampton Agricultural Show.
- 4. The Rockhampton Agricultural Show will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accident on the ground or premises, nor will the Rockhampton Agricultural Show, under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to, or misdelivery of any exhibits.
- 5. Any exhibitor who does not comply with the above rules or any directions of the Competition Steward may be penalised or disqualified. Any dispute that may arise shall be decided by not less than three (3) members of the beef cattle sub-committee and their decision shall be final.
- 6. All cattle entered must carry an NLIS device.
- 7. All cattle entered in Stud Cattle classes must be registered in the name of the exhibitor as owner in a properly constituted herd book of the relevant breed association and must comply with the rules and regulations of the relevant breed association.
- 8. All exhibitors to provide hard copy proof of \$5 million Public Liability cover with entry form or with Waybill/NVD Declaration upon arrival at Showgrounds.
- 9. In all cases where age is a condition of entry, the understanding is that the exhibitor will, if called upon, sign a statutory declaration to the age of the animal entered. For all classes in which the age of the exhibit is a condition of the competition, the animal application for entry form will state the actual date of birth, which will be used to attain the age as at 1 June 2025 and the exhibit shall be entered in the classes accordingly.
- 10. Calves shown with Dams are ineligible to compete in individual calf classes.
- 11. In the event of insufficient numbers to warrant a breed section, sections may be combined.
- 12. The Rockhampton Agricultural Show reserves the right to combine classes in the event of there being insufficient numbers to judge as a single class. A maximum of two adjoining classes maybe combined.
- 13. Exhibitors are requested to pay particular attention to the animal application for entry form which should be completed in all detail, as it is from this document that the catalogue will be compiled.
- 14. The only person authorised to inject animals while they are at the showgrounds, is the on-call Event Veterinarian, who shall advise the Competition Stewards if in their opinion such drug or tranquiliser is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize.

BIOSECURITY

- 15. Cattle bought onto the Rockhampton Showgrounds must comply with the requirements of the 2025 Rockhampton Show Biosecurity Plan.
- 16. If an animal becomes ill it may be moved to the designated quarantine area, at the discretion of the Chief Biosecurity Officer or the on-call Event Veterinarian.

- 17. If the on-call Event Veterinarian is required the owner of the animal is responsible for payments to the Veterinarian.
- 18. The Show PIC is to be used when entering the grounds QGRH0079
- 19. If the Chief Biosecurity Officer requests documents, information or directs a person to undertake an action, these requests must be complied with.

JBAS REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE

- 20. All cattle entering the Rockhampton Agricultural Show must be a JBAS score of 6, 7 or 8. This score must be disclosed in the entry form under the 'Current Health Status' column.
- 21. Management of JBAS at Rockhampton Agricultural Show is the exhibitor's responsibility, and exhibitors should understand the management options for Johne's disease and these should be identified in their own biosecurity plans.

MOVEMENT RECORD

- 22. All stock must have a Waybill or NVD which must be presented at time of NLIS scanning
- 23. Only tick free stock will be allowed entry on to the grounds.
- 24. Exhibitors returning to tick free Country need to make their own clearance arrangements. Feel free to discuss with committee for local contacts.

NLIS

- 25. All animals must have an NLIS device fitted prior to leaving the property of origin (this includes calves).
- 26. As a precaution it is advisable to have replacement tags available in the event of a missing or faulty tag.

STOCK

- 27. All male and commercial heifer exhibits must be weighed, commencing at 9am Wednesday 11 June 2025.
- 28. All bulls over the age of 12 months must be nose ringed, all females over 12 months, led steers and led commercial heifers must be ringed or dogged when handled on the grounds. Handlers must use nose leads at ALL times when handling these animals and it shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that animals in the stud and led steer and commercial heifer classes which are brought onto the grounds are tractable and able to be restrained and handled without causing damage.
- 29. Any animal which behaves in an unsatisfactory manner may be expelled from the stud cattle area by order of the Competition Steward or Judge.
- 30. All cattle are to be restrained properly at night with a halter and neck collar or chain.

GROUPS

- 31. All animals to have been exhibited in their respective classes.
- 32. Breeders Groups (All Breeds except Brahmans) To consist of three (3) exhibits, both sexes to be represented, not necessarily owned but bred by the exhibitor.
- 33. Brahman Breeders Group To consist of a pair of males and a pair of females, not necessarily owned but bred by the exhibitor.
- 34. Sire's Progeny Groups To consist of three (3) progeny with both sexes to be represented, all from the same sire and owned by the exhibitor. (The sire's name to be listed).
- 35. Dam's Progeny Group To consist of two (2) progeny males and/or females
- 36. all from the same dam and owned by the exhibitor. (The dam's name to be listed).

JUDGING

- 37. The entries will be arranged and paraded in order from youngest to oldest in each class.
- 38. For championship prizes (Senior Champion, Junior Champion, Calf champion), all 1st prize winners of each sex and breed to compete. After selecting the champion, the judge will be required to select an animal which will take the place of the Champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause. The Reserve Champion shall be selected from the remaining 1st prize animals, together with 2nd prize of the class which furnished the champion.
- 39. A Supreme Champion Bull and Female, shall be awarded with the Grand Champion or Champion of each breed as the case may be to compete. A Supreme Champion Breeders Group shall be awarded with the winning breeder's group from each breed to compete.
- 40. The order of presentation of ribbons will be 1st Blue, 2nd Red, 3rd White

EXHIBITOR ATTIRE

41. All persons parading stock in the Judging ring are required to be neatly presented.

BEDDING & FODDER

- 42. Sawdust bedding will be provided by the Rockhampton Agricultural Show for use.
- 43. The use of straw is not permitted due to fire regulations.
- 44. The provision of fodder is the responsibility of the exhibitor.
- 45. Exhibitors must provide their own buckets for stockwater.

WASHING

- 46. Washing of cattle on the grounds is permitted only in the designated wash bay areas and only using shampoo brands which are Phosphorus free.
- 47. Failure to comply with this regulation will render exhibitors liable to substantial fines under Department of Environment legislation and the animal ineligible to compete.

EXHIBITOR ENTRY

- 48. Exhibitors and livestock attendants, will be provided with an exhibitor's Wristband on the following entries:
- 49. 1 to 3 head 1 wristband
- 50. 4 to 6 head 2 wristband
- 51. 7 to 9 head 3 wristband
- 52. Over 9 head 4 wristband
- 53. Additional wristbands may be purchased for \$5 at the Rockhampton Showgrounds Administration office. Exhibitor Wristbands must be worn at all times.

CAMPING

- 54. Camp sites: \$28.50 per night including 1 x 15amp power outlet. Additional power outlets can be requested at \$55 each.
- 55. Bookings are to be made for both camping locations Graeme Acton Way & Victoria Park. This can be done through Showday Online and clicking "Extras".
- 56. Caravans/Trailer/Trucks are to be in place by 10am Wednesday 11 June 2025.

PRIZE MONEY

- 57. All prize money will be paid during the Stud Cattle Competitions Thursday 12 and Friday 13 June 2025.
 - From Monday 16 June 2025 prize money will be available for collection from Rockhampton Regional Council City Hall Customer Service office (232 Bolsover St, Rockhampton City QLD 4700) 9am - 4pm Monday to Friday until 30 June 2025.
 - Any prize money not collected by 30 June 2025 will be forfeited and allocated to the next year's Show.
 - Prize money will **not** be handed out without the prize card being presented to the Competition Steward or Rockhampton Regional Council staff.

- All steers will be mouthed at weighing.
- o All steers to be weighed by 2pm Wednesday 11 June 2025.
- o All steers entered in this competition must be milk-tooth only.
- Steers with HGP are eligible.
- o All steers must be led and tractable.
- No drug or tranquiliser shall be administered to any animal exhibit except under. The
 direction of a veterinary surgeon who shall advise the Competition Steward if in their
 opinion such drug or tranquiliser is likely to have any effect upon the animal which
 would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize.
- Junior Led Steers are not eligible for open competition but are eligible for Grand Champion Led Steer.

JUNIOR LED STEER
