Regulations

Privacy Statement

Rockhampton Regional Council (RRC) is collecting the personal information you supply for the purpose of Rockhampton Agricultural Show communications. RRC deals with personal information in accordance with law, including the Information Privacy Act 2009. Some of this information may be given to customers, sponsors and event partners and listed on Council's website for the purpose of advertising.

General

1. Please note there may be some changes to classes, regulations and procedures from previous years. To ensure that there are no issues with your entries, please read this schedule carefully.
2. The Rockhampton Agricultural Show and their volunteers will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibitor, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold Rockhampton Agricultural Show harmless and indemnified against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident.
3. The lodgement of a completed Animal Application for Entry form will be taken as a guarantee that the animals specified therein are free from all disease as far as is known by the owner. In the case of an infectious disease being spread through or by an exhibit, the exhibitor shall be held responsible.
4. Precautions will be taken to guard against fire and to protect the property at the show, but exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Rockhampton Agricultural Show.
5. The Rockhampton Agricultural Show will not, under any circumstances, hold itself liable for any accident on the ground or premises, nor will the Rockhampton Agricultural Show, under any circumstances, hold itself responsible for any loss, damage to, or misdelivery of any exhibits.
6. Any exhibitor who does not comply with the above rules or any directions of the Chief Steward may be penalised or disqualified. Any dispute that may arise shall be decided by not less than three (3) members of the beef cattle sub-committee and their decision shall be final.

Entry

7. All cattle entered must carry an NLIS device.
8. All cattle entered in stud cattle classes must be registered in the name of the exhibitor as owner in a properly constituted herd book of the relevant breed association and must comply with the rules and regulations of the relevant breed association.
9. All exhibitors to provide hard copy proof of \$5 million Public Liability cover with entry form or with Waybill/NVD Declaration upon arrival at showgrounds.
10. In all cases where age is a condition of entry, the understanding is that the exhibitor will, if called upon, sign a statutory declaration to the age of the animal entered. For all classes in which the age of the exhibit is a condition of the competition, the Animal Application for Entry form will state the actual date of birth, which will be used to attain the age as at 1st June 2026 and the exhibit shall be entered in the classes accordingly.
11. Calves shown with Dams are ineligible to compete in individual calf classes.

12. In the event of insufficient numbers to warrant a breed section, sections may be combined.
13. The Rockhampton Agricultural Show reserves the right to combine classes in the event of there being insufficient numbers to judge as a single class. A maximum of two adjoining classes may be combined.
14. Exhibitors are requested to pay particular attention to the Animal Application for Entry form which should be completed in all detail, as it is from this document that the catalogue will be compiled.
15. The only person authorised to inject animals while they are at the showgrounds, is the honorary veterinarian, who shall advise the stewards if in their opinion such drug or tranquiliser is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize.

JBAS Requirements For Cattle

16. All cattle entering the Rockhampton Agricultural Show must be a JBAS score of 6, 7 or 8.
17. Management of JBAS at Rockhampton Agricultural Show is the exhibitor's responsibility, and exhibitors should understand the management options for Johne's disease and these should be identified in their own biosecurity plans.

FEES (GST Inclusive)

18. Single Entry Nomination Fee: \$20.00 per head (includes Bedding Levy).
19. Group Entry Nomination Fee: \$10.00 per group.
20. Led Steer/Commercial Heifer Nomination Fee: \$40.00 per head.
21. Entry forms not accompanied by entry fees will not be accepted.
22. EFTPOS facilities are available at the office for your convenience.

Camping

23. Application for camping must be made on the Entry form.
24. Camp sites are priced at \$30 per night and include one (1) 15amp power outlet, two (2) access passes (for two people), and one (1) car pass.
Additional items may be requested as follows:
 - a) Additional power outlets: \$55 each
 - b) Additional access passes: \$5 each
 - c) Additional car passes: \$10 each

Arrival

25. Exhibits must be on the grounds prior to 10am Wednesday 10th June 2026
26. Caravans/Trailer/Trucks are to be in place by 10am Wednesday 10th June 2026

Exhibitor Entry

27. Exhibitors and livestock attendants, will be provided with an Exhibitor's Wristband on the following entries:
 - a) 1 to 3 head - 1 wristband
 - b) 4 to 6 head - 2 wristband
 - c) 7 to 9 head - 3 wristband

- d) Over 9 head - 4 wristband
28. Additional wristbands may be purchased for \$5 at the office. Exhibitor Wristbands must be worn at all times

Stock

29. All Male and commercial heifer Exhibits must be weighed, commencing at 9am Wednesday 10th June 2026.
30. All bulls over the age of 12 months must be nose ringed, all females over 12 months, led steers and led commercial heifers must be ringed or dogged when handled on the grounds. Handlers must use nose leads at ALL times when handling these animals and it shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that animals in the stud and led steer and commercial heifer section which are brought onto the grounds are tractable and able to be restrained and handled without causing damage.
31. Any Animal which behaves in an unsatisfactory manner may be expelled from the stud cattle area by order of the Chief Steward or Judge.
32. All cattle are to be restrained properly at night with a halter and neck collar or chain.

Bedding & Fodder

33. Sawdust bedding will be provided by the Rockhampton Agricultural Show for use.
34. The use of straw is not permitted due to fire regulations.
35. The provision of fodder is the responsibility of the exhibitor.
36. Exhibitors must provide their own buckets for stockwater.

Washing

37. Washing of cattle on the grounds is permitted only in the designated wash bay areas and only using shampoo brands which are Phosphorus free.
38. Failure to comply with this regulation will render Exhibitors liable to substantial fines under Department of Environment legislation and the animal ineligible to compete.

Movement Record

39. All stock must have a Waybill or NVD which must be presented at time of NLIS scanning
40. Only tick free stock will be allowed entry on to the grounds.
41. **Exhibitors returning to tick free country need to make their own clearance arrangements.** Feel free to discuss with committee for local contacts.

NLIS

42. All animals must have an NLIS device fitted prior to leaving the property of origin (this includes calves).
43. As a precaution it is advisable to have replacement tags available in the event of a missing or faulty tag.

Departure

44. Cattle entered for competition must be on display for the duration of the Show and are NOT permitted to leave the grounds prior to 4.00pm Friday, 12th June 2026.

Dogs

45. No Dogs are permitted on the Showgrounds.

Groups

48. All animals to have been exhibited in their respective classes.
49. **Breeders Groups** (All Breeds except Brahman) - To consist of three (3) exhibits, both sexes to be represented, **owned and bred by the Exhibitor**.
50. **Brahman Breeders Group** – To consist of a pair of males and a pair of females, **owned and bred by the Exhibitor**.
51. **Sire's Progeny Groups** – To consist of three (3) progeny with both sexes to be represented, all from the same sire and **owned by the exhibitor**. (The sire's name to be listed).
52. **Dam's Progeny Group** - To consist of two (2) progeny males and/or females all from the same dam and owned by the exhibitor. (The dam's name to be listed).

Judging

53. The entries will be arranged and paraded in order from youngest to oldest in each class.
54. For championship prizes (Senior Champion, Junior Champion, Calf champion), all 1st prize winners of each sex and breed to compete. After selecting the champion, the judge will be required to select an animal which will take the place of the Champion in the event of the latter being disqualified for any cause. The Reserve Champion shall be selected from the remaining 1st prize animals, together with 2nd prize of the class which furnished the champion.
55. A Supreme Champion Bull and Female shall be awarded with the Grand Champion or Champion of each breed as the case may be to compete. A Supreme Champion

Breeders Group shall be awarded with the winning breeder's group from each breed to compete.

56. The order of presentation of ribbons will be 1st - Blue, 2nd - Red, 3rd – White

Exhibitor Attire

57. All persons parading stock in the Judging ring are required to be neatly presented. All competitors are encouraged to wear a breed uniform, dust coat or vest.

- All steers will be mouthed at weighing.
- All steers to be weighed by 2pm Wednesday 10th June 2026.
- All steers entered in this competition must be milk-tooth only.
- Steers with HGP are eligible.
- All steers must be led and tractable.
- No drug or tranquiliser shall be administered to any animal exhibit except under the direction of a veterinary surgeon who shall advise the Competition Steward if in their opinion such drug or tranquiliser is likely to have any effect upon the animal which would be material to its chances of being awarded a prize.
- Junior Led Steers are not eligible for open competition but are eligible for Grand Champion Led Steer.

Open to any person who is a fulltime student at a School or College.

The Agriculture Department of Schools and Colleges may nominate in their own right. Any person entering as an individual must be 18 years and under at the date of competition.
